Warming up

Lots of interesting hands on the warm-up last night.


Out of 36 boards not less than 8 of them allowed a slam for either side. For instance on board 22 NS could make 6♣, by dropping the singleton ♠K when you only have 5 cards between the two hands. My kind of slam! Amazingly enough no one bid it.

Board 15, on the other hand, saw a lot of fireworks. The points are evenly split between the lines, but that doesn't tell the whole story. NS have 10 hearts between them and EW 11 diamonds between them. As cards lie, and considering best defence, NS can make only 2♥, but EW can make a whopping 6♦! Most NS pairs found that out, but only after doubling 5 or 6♦ by their opponents. Only 2 NS pairs managed to buy the contract at the 4 level, and surprisingly they both managed to win 4♥ (one of them doubled). The next best result for NS is to go quietly when opponents bid to 5♦. If you managed that, you got 24 out of 30 matchpoints! Even going 500 down in 5♥ is better than average. (19 out of 30 matchpoints). On the EW line two pairs got to 6♦ (obviously doubled) and got 29 out of 30 matchpoints, closely followed by 5♦ xx with one overtrick. A cool 1000 for only 26 matchpoints. The "run of the mill" -650 (5♦x with 1 overtrick) paid 12 mp to NS and 18 mp to EW.

Board 21 is another interesting slam. NS might be able to bid to 6♠. If they do, declarer will have to take the right view on the diamond position, or it may be very costly. With favourable vulnerability, East likely to pre-empt in Hearts. If he does so and then leads the ♦10 declarer should be able to read it as a singleton, especially after 3 rounds of spades. Even without a diamond lead a shrewd declarer might be able to guess the diamond position after a pre-empt. However, if there was no bidding by East, the natural play seems to go for diamonds 3-2. When they misbehave, you still have the chance of the club finesse, but when that fails too you can lose up to 1 club and 3 hearts for a heavy 3 down. One NS pair (Thorvaldsson & Steingstinsson) managed to get everything right and earned a full top.

On lower level board 3 also had a wide range of results. This was one of those lousy mis-fitting hands where whoever ended up playing would be going down. In fact only one pair managed to make the contract, and was dully punished with a below average 14 out of 30 matchpoints. Results ranged from +800 to -800. The most popular contract was 3♦ by East (often doubled).

Double-dummy there's a line where you can try to manage to go only one down. The normal lead for South is a top heart. After that the best move is to switch to the ♣Q to kill the dummy and prevent a discard on the ♣K. When declarer plays the ♣K North ruffs small. Now you have to overruff, cash the ♠A and exit with the ♦J. South wins with the King, but what can he do. A diamond return will elapse North's diamond trick. South may cash the ♣J and the ♥K, but declarer will just discard losing spades. And now South will have to give dummy the lead for a spade discard. Alternatively North may ruff, but declarer will overruff and again remove North's trump trick.

The defenders may do better, though. South may play small on the ♦J allowing North to be on hand to cash the spade winners and play the fifth one to promote South's ♦K. Not an easy defence.
