
A long way for a Top

Some people travelled a long way to come to this Tournament. Take Gustavo Chediak. He came from Montevideo, Uruguay, over 8 500 Kms away! And he's not the record holder - Mr. Jose Saphores came from Chile, over 9 200 Kms away.

Anyway, back to Gustavo. He played with his lovely daughter and finished 7^{th} overall. Yesterday, they bid their way to $4 \checkmark$ on board 25.

The lead was the \checkmark 7. South won with the King and returned the &K. Declarer won with the Ace and crossed to the &J. On the three high diamonds he pitched 3 clubs. He


then played a fourth diamond ruffing low when South pitched a spade. A spade to the Queen followed, and then the $\triangle A$ from dummy. South had to ruff now or declarer would have just pitched the losing club and played on trumps. But when he did, declarer still pitched a club. Now, after ruffing the club return, declarer just had to guess the trump position, which he did by playing the $\lor Q$ from hand. $4 \lor M$ made was a cold top for EW.

A good, a bad and an ugly double

Penalty doubles frequently occur in a pairs' tournament as the difference between +100 and +200 or even +50 and +100 could be huge. On the next hand, this year's winners bid all the way up to $6 \triangleq$ and West didn't believe them.


West led the A. Julius Sigurjonsson ruffed and played the J, confining his losers in the trump suit to one and securing his contract.

West's double turned out to be bad because it gave away the hand. Without the double, declarer could (and should) have played a spade to the ace, winning the slam with *KQ doubleton in either hand or a bare honour card with West.

At another table West also doubled 6 and that double turned out to be very good. He led a club. Declarer won in dummy with J and tried to enter his hand with A. That was not a good idea. West ruffed and continued a club for East to ruff. A heart, a club and another heart meant +1100 for EW.

Sometimes, when the opponents are clearly in the wrong spot, you should refrain from doubling, even in a pairs' game. When you have a goose at a string, don't let it escape. It's just what South did on the next hand.

Board 10



East opened with 1• and after the take-out double from South, West did not have a satisfying bid. He came up with 1•. East naturally raised to 2• and, reasoning that +620 would beat a likely +600 at the other tables, West bid 4•. Three top winners and the jack fifth in trumps proved to be too much for South. He made an ugly double, prompting West to take shelter in 5•. North thought he also had a trick with *K and doubled, only to find out that 5• was cold.
