Germany Takes the Lead!

Michael Gromöller and Helmut Häusler won yesterday's session. The Germans scored just over 70% and took the lead of the tournament with 62.94% overall.

The Portuguese pair Rui Pinto and Juliano Barbosa got 61.37% (10th) on the second session which secured them the second place overall, just 0.63% behind the leaders.

Andis Gesta and Maija Romanovska weren't so fortunate on the second session. They made 58.58% and dropped to 3rd place overall.

Suzanne Zach and Maximilian Buchmayr, who came second on the warmup, were second on yesterday's session. They got 67.30% and are now 24th overall.

Hans Metselaar and Allie Hoenstock were third. They made 64.75% on the session, which got them the 30th place on the tournament.

There are 11 pairs within 5% of the leaders. Any slip, any overtrick can make you win or lose a prize. It will be close until the last card...

Open Pairs - Session 2

Wednesday saw the second session of the Open Pairs get under way, though for some the bus journey back from the 'Typical Dinner' at the O Lagar Restaurant will have been more memorable, especially for Reini. Suffice it to say that the entertainment was masterminded by Ulla (yes the same Ulla who made the 7NT yesterday) who had control of the bus's microphone. As the old expression goes – "What happens on the bus, stays on the bus." But back to the important stuff – the bridge.

Fortunately for me there was a suitable place for viewing directly behind Miguel Teixeira, the President of the Madeira Bridge Association and chief organizer of the event, and his partner, Diego Brenner, a frequent member of the Brazilian national team. The basis of their system is five-card majors and a strong NT, though a point weaker in third and fourth position.

We shall start with Board I, a very good place to start.

South's Double was asking North to bid something and discovering he had a six-card suit he bid it. Some might say that East's intervention was bold, but it had the effect of making N/S play in an inferior scoring contract. The lead was a small heart taken with the ten. Declarer cashed the ace of diamonds, played a spade towards dummy on which East hopped up with his king and exited with a second round of hearts. Miguel cleared the trumps and West's fate was sealed when he had to win the second round of clubs and give declarer a trick in dummy to discard his losing club. Making the contract netted 58%, but being allowed to make 2NT would have been worth 75%, so the brave intervention saved several matchpoints.

Our next board we have the perennial problem of what to do with a big hand opposite a pre-empt.

The right contract reached but the great shuffler had the last laugh when West had an obvious lead of a heart to his partner's ace and when he continued the suit South was in hand and naturally played a small spade towards the queen and now had two spade losers. Those whose bidding system allowed North to play the contract frequently received a minor-suit lead and so naturally lead a small spade towards the king and so picked up the trumps for just one loser. There was one pair who bid and made Six Spades, "for a top?" I hear you cry, "No" is the response for another pair bid and made Five Spades redoubled, scoring 1000 as opposed to the 980 of the slam bidders. Failing in Five Spades was still worth 33% of the matchpoints.

Our next hand again features a pre-empt but this time at the two-level.

The Two Diamonds bid was a weak two in hearts and Three Hearts was to play. With the points almost equally divided between the East and West hands neither of them

found a way into the auction and so got nowhere towards their game contract in spades. Three Hearts drifted a peaceful two off for an impressive 85%.

Earlier editions of the bulletin have featured grand slams and this one is no different.

Yet again we have an ‘interesting’ interjection by West. If, like me, you are easily amused by little things then the fact that the person with a six-card spade suit was the only person at the table not to bid them will amuse you. Whether West’s overcall made things harder or easier for North/South is a moot point but it was hard for South to visualise North’s actual hand and after the Six Hearts bid went into the tank before emerging with a raise to the grand slam. It was now North’s turn for deep thought after the lead of the ace of spades. He started well by ruffing this but how should he continue? To make the contract hearts have to be 2-2 and the clubs have to come in but now we have the question of tackling the clubs. Miguel decided on taking one round and then ruffing one in hand, this will work whenever the clubs are 3-3 or the queen of clubs is singleton or doubleton, just over 50% according to my calculations which is certainly a lot better than a first-round finesse. The bridge gods were smiling on this contract and it duly came home for all the matchpoints as no one else bid the grand.

The Greek Gift

Although there were only three slams available yesterday, making them was certainly not easy.

When you are in Seven Hearts you have only one winning line: dump five of your spades on dummies clubs and one on the ace of diamonds. When trumps break or the queen drops, you are home. But what is the right way to handle the clubs? To go for a simple finesse is not the correct way. After cashing two top trumps it is better to play the clubs from the top and decide if you want to ruff the third round when West plays a small card on the third round. Your troubles are over since West has to follow with the queen. On our table North thought he was in trouble after East tried the lead of the ace of spades against Six Hearts. Declarer ruffed the trick and handled the clubs the right way, but he did not trust the trumps to break. He therefore ruffed another spade in dummy, cashed the king of hearts and led the good clubs now. West ruffed with the queen of hearts whereupon East discarded his last spade. West played a spade and now declarer ran into an extra ruff by the defense. The lead of the ace of spades was a Greek gift after all.

North's revenge was bitter sweet when he had to defend Six Diamonds after he had made a jump overcall in clubs, supported by his partner. North cashed the ace of clubs and got off lead with his singleton trump. Now it was West who needed to know the location of the queen of hearts. After drawing trumps he decided that the chances of this red lady was greater to be in the South hand. If you believe in split queens, which is nonsense to my

humble opinion, you know you should play North for this card. But I do believe in 'the theory of the vacant places' so let's have a look which hand has most open spaces. North is known to have two spades, one diamond and six or seven clubs. That leaves him with three or four vacant places. South is known to have four spades two diamonds and three or four clubs. So he also has three or four vacant places. Playing the jack from hand will work only against that lovely lady in your club back home, but not here, against a man who just went down in a cold slam. You now know what happened: partner went down as he believed the heart queen to be in the South hand. So the points were divided at this table.

After a One Spade opening from East, South thought an overcall in clubs was normal on this hand. Had E/W decided to defend this, South probably would still be writing zeros at the end of his score in the out column. The potential maelstrom passed when E/W bid on to their spade game. East could make twelve tricks but since North was favourite to hold four spades, East finessed the spade jack and ended with only eleven tricks.

East again opened one spade but this time it was nearly half of the point count he had on the previous board. South looked at the convention card as she couldn't believe that East was serious this time. South decided that passing was the best thing to do, but with all vulnerable even six down would not gain since there was a game for her side in three different strains. South was thrown in a number of times and when the smoke cleared declarer had four tricks in the bag and a monster haul of matchpoints in the pocket. Crime pays after all...
