### Records Keep Tumbling!

165 pairs are playing in this year's Pairs' Tournaments. We broke another record.

The Italian pair Massimiliano di Franco and Andrea Manno won the first session of the Pairs' Tournament, with 72.74%.

The Danish pair Gregers Bjarnarson and Anders Hagen were second, just 1.48% behind the leaders.

Sveinn R Eiriksson and Bjarni Einarsson are third. These Icelanders scored 64.26%.

The first Portuguese pair is Reinaldo Timoteo and Antonio C Palma. They are 8<sup>th</sup>, with 62.09%.

Though the two first pairs have a clear 7% lead, there are still 30 pairs within 15% and there are still two sessions to play.

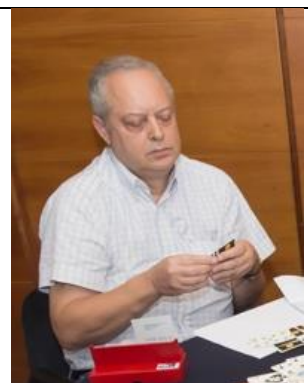

### Italians lead the way

After the first session of the Open Pairs Massimiliano Di Franco and Andrea Manno from Italy are in the lead with a phenomenal 72.74%. Gregers Bjarnarson and Anders Hagen from Denmark did not do bad either with 71.26%. The rest of the field follows at a polite distance.

On this hand Di Franco took advantage from a friendly defence.

Against 3NT East led the spade 6. The 10 won and declarer continued with spade queen which East decided to duck. Now Di Franco cashed his winners in clubs and diamonds bringing East down to ♠A-K and ♥K-J. The throw-in produced a vital second overtrick. Plus 660 scored 88%, where plus 630 would have been slightly below average.

On the next hand the opponents could not be blamed for presenting the young Italians with a full top.

West seized the opportunity to show his heart suit and was severely punished. Manno was happy to play 2♥ redoubled with his K-9-8 of trumps. West led a diamond. Declarer won in hand and advanced ♥9, winning the trick. He played a diamond to the queen, a spade to the king and another diamond to the king. Now he cashed ♠A and ruffed a spade with ♥K. West overruffed and returned a trump. Manno ended up with making one overtrick for plus 840 and a score of 100%.

## Euromillions

To some extent playing matchpoints can be something of a lottery - not only do you have to play well, but you must also hope that your opponents will make a few generous donations to your cause. I decided to follow the fortunes of two World Champions taking part, Jan & Aida Jansma.

At the end of the play, North asked me if I would have balanced with his hand. I gave him the diplomatic answer, but I recall a piece of advice from Tony Forrester - “when the opponents have shown a fit and drop the bidding early, you should always balance”. It would have paid a big dividend here.

North led the eight of spades and South took dummy's king with the ace and returned a spade, North winning with the queen and making a thoughtful switch to the six of clubs. Declarer won with the ace and played a heart to the nine and ace. Now it is clear for South to play a diamond. North will duck, and as long as South takes the king of trumps and plays a second diamond she will score a ruff for one down.

When South returned a club declarer could win and play a trump, taking eight tricks for +110. That was worth only 20.3-133.7 for NS. +50 would have been 77-77, but +140 (for nine tricks in spades) would have been worth 135.8-18.2.

South led the queen of clubs for the king and ace and North switched to the five of diamonds, South winning by taking declarer's king with the ace and continuing with two rounds of clubs. At this point North should exit with a diamond, removing a vital entry from dummy and ensuring a fifth trick for the defenders. Switching to a deceptive jack of spades did not work - declarer won, crossed to the queen of diamonds and ran the queen of hearts. When it held he took a spade finesse, cashed the major suit aces and could claim, +140 and 36.5-117.5. Defeating 3♠ would have been worth 122.6-31.4.

At many tables East led a diamond, gifting declarer a trick, and with the club finesse onside that was +690.

When East opted for the five of hearts declarer appeared to be in trouble. He won in hand and returned the suit, East taking the ace and exiting with a third heart. Declarer won in dummy, played a club to the queen followed by three rounds of spades, pitching a club from dummy. His mind made up he played the jack of diamonds from hand and ran it, claiming twelve tricks when it held. That gave NS 90.2-63.8 - whereas +660 would have been only 18.2-135.8.

South alerted North's natural 2♥, explaining it as a transfer to spades. When East surprisingly didn't bother to raise clubs, North marked time with 3♣ and then tried 4♥. When South asked for key cards North showed three. When South's next bid was 5♥ (presumably asking about the queen of spades) North decided it was a good time to bow out.

East led a club (the only lead to be sure of beating 6♥!) and declarer won in dummy, drew trumps and cashed the ace of spades, +450 and 90.4-63.6.

At another table, declarer won the club lead, cashed the ace of diamonds, ruffed a diamond crossed to dummy with a trump, ruffed a diamond high, drew the outstanding trump and played a low spade. East thought for some time before playing low - but declarer put in dummy's nine and was back to eleven tricks instead of the twelve that would have scored 119.7-34.3.

Several pairs made 6♥ when East led a top spade and Bjorg Houmoller & Jonas Houmoller made it doubled after a club lead (!) with +1210 being 153.8-0.2. Remember what I said about donations!

## A Double Squeeze In The Warm-up Pairs

Hans Kreuning from the Netherlands executed a fine double squeeze in the warm-up pairs.

Against 3NT, East picked his wrong five-card suit to lead. So the first trick was won by the 8 of spades in South. Kreuning played a club to the 10. East won with the king and returned a spade to the king. Declarer now made the key play of giving away a diamond trick to rectify the count. He ran the diamond 9 and after winning the trick West returned a club (the inconceivable return of the diamond king would have broken the upcoming squeeze). Kreuning won with club 9 and cashed two more club tricks, throwing two hearts from dummy. He cashed the ace of spades, crossed to the king of hearts and played heart jack to the ace. Finally he led his fifth club. In order to keep the spade queen, East had to bare his diamond jack. In dummy spade jack had done his job and now West was squeezed in hearts and diamonds: plus 660 and an 87% score.

West’s takeout double tells South where the key cards are. Taking advantage of that knowledge might be a good idea!

South won the ace of clubs, drew trumps and led a low club towards dummy’s K 9, hoping to put West on lead with a third club. West stepped in with the jack of clubs to avoid the endplay. East in with the third club played the ten of diamonds and ended South hopes of an endplay.

South can endplay West, but must take good care! Let the queen of clubs hold the first trick! Win the club continuation with the king of clubs and ruff a low spade. Take two rounds of trumps and the ace of clubs. Cross to the table with a third trump and play the queen of spades discarding a low diamond! West is endplayed either to give you a ruff and sluff or play a diamond into your tenace!
