## High Level Bridge in Estoril

The 2005 Bermuda Bowl has just finished last Saturday. Congratulations to the Italian team, this year's winners and new World Champions! The Lavazza team finally got the only title that still eluded them - they already won the teams in Madeira a few years back. Here's a couple of high level decisions that helped them get ahead on the crucial 6<sup>th</sup> segment. See what you would do before moving on to see the results.

You hold:

♠ Q 4

♥ A Q J T 5 4 3

♦ J

♣ A 9 4

And the auction goes, with no one vulnerable, Pass on your left, 4 ♦, natural and pre-emptive by partner, Pass on your right. What would you do?

Then, Vulnerable vs. not, you hold:

♠

♥ 9 6 3 2

♦ 9 6 3 2


♣ A K Q 5 4

You pass in first seat, 4♠ natural and pre-emptive on your left, passed back to you. What would you do now?

On the first hand Meckstroth bid what seemed a normal 4♥, but Fulvio Fantoni showed great judgement on passing his partner's opening bid. When you think of it, partner opened over the level of 3 NT so there is no way he can cover 3 of your 6 losers, so you should let him play in his own suit. That was worth 5 imps to Italy.

On the second hand you have to decide who has the high cards. If it is partner he may not have a clear-cut action over 4♠, if it is RHO you should stay out of it. Unexpectedly it was Paul Soloway that took the high road and Lorenzo Lauria that meekly sold out. Lauria may have thought that his partner would double with high card strength, with or without trump tricks, since most people treat 4 NT over 4♠ as a kind of take-out double. Soloway may have feared that the Italians in the closed room would not sit out of the action and jumped in trying not to create a swing (USA was ahead starting this segment). The result was - on the closed room the Americans played a quiet 4♠, making an overtrick. On the open room the auction continued Double, Pass, Pass, Redouble, 4NT, Pass, 5♦, Double, all Pass. Even though the Italians did not find the double dummy defence of leading a club or switching to clubs after a heart lead, they still picked up 800 and 8 imps.

Just a note: In the Venice Cup the German ladies did even worse by passing 4♠xx for minus 1080. That may seem foolish, but it was the penultimate board of their match and they were trailing for a lot - they needed action.
