The Latvians **Uldis** Bethers, Juris Balasovs, Liga Brikmane and Peteris Bethers are the team Marupe. They lead the Teams' Tournament. They won round 1 by 25-4 and rounds 2 and 3 by 22-8.

The Portuguese team Baleal (Rui S Santos, Jorge Cruzeiro, Manuel Oliveira,



Sulina Pimenta and Carlos Pimenta) is second, 9 VPs behind. They won the first two matches (25-3 and 21-9) but lost the last match of the evening to Alizee, who are in third place, by 14-16.

The Austrian team Alizee (Jovanka Smederevac, Jorg Eichholzer, Doris Fischer, Bernd Saurer and Robert Franzel) had won the two first matches (21-9 and 22-8) and are now just 1 VP behind the Portuguese.

There is a lot to play today. 6 matches will take the afternoon and the evening. 17 out of the 41 teams in the tournament are within 20 VPs of the leader - Just a stone-throw away...



## The five level belongs to you


One of the most useful advices that was ever entered in the Bols Bridge Tip Competition was given by Ed Manfield: "Think twice before you bid five over five. The five level belongs to the opponents." In the first day of the Teams Tournament, however, it would have been better to have ignored it.

Board 2




If North bids  $5 \checkmark$ , EW had better bid five over five. In  $5 \checkmark$  declarer will get the diamonds right and score 650. The save in spades only costs 300.

#### Board 7



Again, if NS decide to compete with  $5 \checkmark$ , it would save EW a lot of points to bid again. The par score is  $5 \triangleq$  doubled minus one. Board 20



West's  $2\P$  opening bid will not have been everyone's choice and neither his fearless entrance at the five level. After declarer had played the hearts from top, there was no way to deny him eleven tricks: 850 for EW. Here too, bidding  $5\P$  would have been advisable, costing only 500.


## Playing the good, the bad and the unlucky



Not so for Miguel Teixeira. He took the spade lead so fast that it did not occur to South to unblock the Queen. So now he only needed the King of diamonds and the Ace of hearts in their proper places and to make 4 club tricks from AJ532 opposite Q97. A small club to the nine solved that problem and 9 tricks were in the bag. Then came board 20:



In our side we went one down in a normal  $4 \clubsuit$ , but Miguel had different ideas about the hand. Everybody vulnerable he proceeded to open a weak 2 in hearts, double from North, raised to three hearts by his partner,  $3 \clubsuit$  from South, passed by Miguel,  $4 \clubsuit$  from North, passed to Miguel who bid  $5 \checkmark$ ! The hearts being 2-2, the clubs onside and the  $\spadesuit$  also on, there was no defense.


But whatever you do, we will be back next year.

## Know your opponents

Our good friend Sveinn Runnar Eiriksson came to me with a nice hand from the pairs' Tournament. He was playing against an "innocent looking man" on his own words. After a straightforward first board, the following auction ensued:

Board 2 (pairs' 2<sup>nd</sup> session)



(\*) 5+♦, 10-14 HCP

The lead was the  $\bullet$ Q. Declarer, who turned out to be Frank Burghout a former Dutch Junior Team member, won with the Ace and played the  $\clubsuit$ Q! It was curtains for the defense now. At the table East covered the Queen and so declarer made it easily by discarding a diamond on the  $\blacktriangledown$ A and taking trumps out. But even if East plays small, declarer will just keep playing clubs. If West ruffs and takes trumps, dummy's third trump will be used to ruff out the  $\clubsuit$ K, if not, declarer will just cross-ruff the remaining tricks (after 3 rounds of clubs, the and the  $\blacktriangledown$ A). The defense really needed a trump lead.

This reminds me of a top Portuguese player that a few years ago while playing this tournament was thinking "this chubby cigar smoking man is the kind of opponent I like...". The cigar man was Paul Chemla...
