José and Ton are going to be a fierce and amazing team, with the help of all the other TDs.

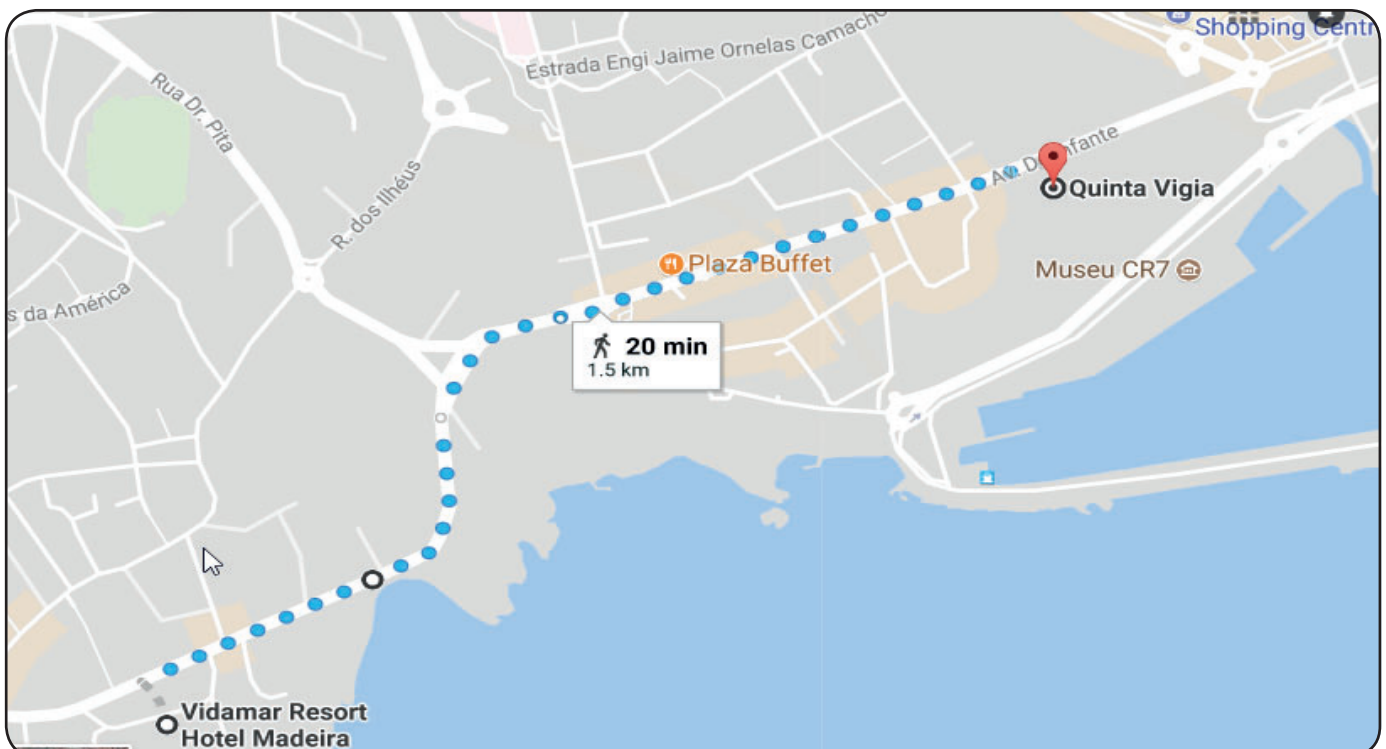

## Hans van Ommeren reflects on the Madeira Bridge Open

In November the weather in Holland usually is cold and rainy. Since 2007 I plan (short) holidays to Madeira, with its pleasant climate, beautiful nature and good food and drink. But above all is the main reason: the bridge tournament.

Never before had I participated in a foreign tournament. A friend of mine has been to Madeira for years to a full satisfaction and she insisted I should go along. I did not have a bridge partner, however this was quickly arranged by Gerard Limmen, the contact person for the Dutch in the tournament. I was immediately hooked on. The island has much to offer for those who enjoy day trips and the tournament takes place in a very pleasant atmosphere. Apparently this is what more people think, because every year more people participate in the tournament. Anyone who has been there once will almost always return again next year and taking other interested people along. The Madeira International Bridge Open has become an reunion with old friends. And that group is getting bigger and bigger. As mentioned before, playing bridge happens in a fine atmosphere, despite the fact that there are many top bridge players from all over the world. That is the merit of the organization and the tournament-directors, who 'do justice' in the spirit of the tournament. Of course, with the application of the rules. The Madeira festival brings exciting adventures every year. Last year I booked the best result so far, a fourth place in the pairs. In addition to playing well, you also need luck. Very much luck. I remember a board from last year that could as well end good as bad.

As South I pick up ♠J987, ♥76532, ♦J74, ♣K. After 1NT on my right, I pass, left pass and my

partner bid, vulnerable against not, Two Spades. Right pass, I pass and LHO bid, after reflection, Three Diamonds. It seems to me that he did the right thing and that we should score very few points. Right I was. I decide to bid one more spade, although the danger threatened that it would be doubled and vulnerable, one down would undoubtedly lead to a zero score. Anyway, in the first place they had to double and in the second place to defend well. The first thing happened, after a short hesitation. They did not do the second....

East started with the diamond ace and played on diamonds. But he had forgotten to take his heart ace and when the third round of diamonds came my partner quickly threw away his stiff heart king. Later he did the clubs right by finessing the queen at East and made his doubled contract of 3♠. That was good for 97 percent. 3♦ just made would give us only 23 percent and an overtrick, not unreal, a lousy 14 percent.

An exciting board, which shows why bridge fascinates time after time. Let the games of the 21st Madeira Bridge Open begin!

## THE BADGES

This year we are all wearing badges. These badges will be issued at the Welcome Desk when you register (see earlier opening times). They are your identification and will be all you need to participate in every event. They show your name, a barcode, a reference number, your player number, and QR-codes for easy access to our website and to the Results pages for the Pairs and Teams. The main programme is printed on the reverse, so that you can see all the session times and what is happening on which day.

You will need your badge to attend any of the social programme activities. Someone will be there to scan your barcode.

The Bridgemate number, as shown in the photo (right), is your player number. You will need to enter this number into the Bridgemate machine at the start of the Pairs and before every match in the Teams (or whenever the machine asks for your number). This will ensure that your name will always appear correctly on the screens and in the results.

When you received your badge included in your envelope was a form. It is very important that you complete this form and bring it with you when you register for the Pairs event on Tuesday (10.30 – 16.00) also ensure that your partner's copy is correctly filled. Without these forms you cannot be issued with a starting position.

So the mantra is 'NO badge, NO play; NO form, NO play.'

## Going through the Card

Mark Horton

'Write something for the Bulletin', says Tacchi. 'About what?', I reply.

'Some of the deals they have already played'.

Personally I think Ron should have emailed David Bird, who writes a regular feature in A New Bridge Magazine entitled 'Deals that Caught my Eye' and asked him to contribute something, but he needs something today and mindful of the words of Andrew Marvel...*at my back I always hear. Time's winged chariot hurrying near* I reluctantly decide to put pen to paper (in a manner of speaking).

This deal is from the National Simultaneous played on the first of November:

### Board 18. Dealer East. N/S Vul.

The first question is what should South open?

Those singleton kings are of incalculable value, and the choice lies between 1♥, 4♥ or perhaps 1♣ for those playing Precision or some other strong club system.

After an opening bid of 4♥ West has an easy 4NT and East bids 5♣. With no room to manoeuvre would you as West advance to 6♣?

When Douglas Rotchell and Dave Blackman held the E/W cards their opponents Mara Vogt and Dorothy Springer played in 6♥ (undoubled!) which suggest that E/W might have bid 6♣ - if so they were the only ones in Madeira to do so.

The following day this was Board 18 in the IMP Pairs:

If South opens 1♣ North responds 1♥ (in the days when 1♥ promised real clubs North might have forced with 2♥) and South rebids 2♣. How would you continue?

One possibility is to try 2♠ and then bid 3♣ over South's 2NT. Now you should be able to reach 6♣ without too much difficulty.

Donna Wood and Jade Barrett were the only pair to bid 6♣, which was worth 11.13 IMPs.

You might like to consider how you would approach the N/S hands were East to open 3♦?

It was too much to expect board 18 to deliver for a third time when the players sat down for the second IMP Pairs, but this deal was not without interest:

If South opens 2♣ West is sure to bid 2♠ and when North passes East has an easy raise to 3♠. When South doubles North must choose between playing for a penalty (+800 on this layout) or bidding 4♥. In the latter case South is not going to

stop short of 6♥ and the odd pair might stretch to 7♥.

On a spade lead declarer ruffs, draws trumps and takes three rounds of diamonds ending in dummy. With West just about certain to be 6-2-3-2 declarer takes the club finesse and then realises that there is no entry back to dummy to cash the long clubs!

Naturally you would take only two rounds of diamonds before finessing in clubs, thereby ensuring that you do not feature in a Misplay these Hands with Me story.

I would love to tell you if anyone bid 7♥ – but the movement meant this deal was not played.

## José Curado explains how to verify the deals using Hans Staveren's procedure.

In short, if someone wants to check that there is no hanky-panky going on with the procedure they should:

- 1 – Download the "present key" from <http://bit.ly/2018pKs> before Friday evening (02.NOV.2018:20:00) or click on link in footer menu on new website
- 2 – Check Euromillions lottery numbers (the "future key")
- 3 – Download the "past key" that will be published after the event (presumably in Bulletin 7)
- 4 – Run the program (download from <http://www.xs4all.nl/~sater/SquareDeal.zip>) using the 3-part key according to the instructions – the "present" and "past" files and insert the 5 numbers and 2 stars, as presented in the official results, comma separated, when prompted by the program.
- 5 -Compare the hands generated this way with the hands actually played.

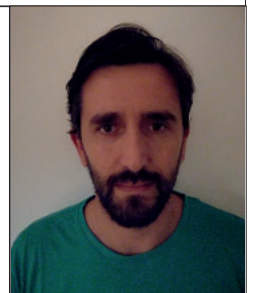
