Yesterday evening more than 200 persons went to the traditional dinner at the O Lagar where they enjoyed copious food and drink and traditional folklore dancing. The attendees joined in boisterously with the festivities and arrived back at their hotel well fed and entertained.

In the Open Pairs the Danish pairing of **Mads Eyde** and **Dennis Bilde** have taken the first spot after the second session of the Open Pairs with a combined score just shy of 63%. **Jorge Cruzeiro** and **Reinaldo Timóteo** from Portugal have moved from third into second place and in third place another Portuguese pair of **Juliano Barbosa** and **António Campos Palma** but only half of a per cent separates all three. To remain at the top of the pack will require a good score today.

Against 6♥ West leads the queen of clubs. You must try to develop dummy's diamond suit. So you win in hand and play the jack of diamonds. West rises with the ace of diamonds and continues with the three of clubs to the ace. You ruff a small diamond with the seven of hearts, cash the ace of spades, ruff a spade with three of hearts and ruff a diamond with queen of hearts. West shows out, discarding the seven of clubs. What next?

There is nothing special about this deal, but I have included it because earlier in the day during the seminar I had mentioned Benito Garozzo's assertion that a player who always made the best opening lead would win every prize on offer. Here South led a spade and declarer won and played back a spade for eleven tricks, 76/128.

The few pairs who restricted declarer to +630 were rewarded with 165/39.

Opening bids are getting lighter by the moment, but East's 1♦ strikes me as wafer thin.

South's overcall hit the jackpot. You can understand why West doubled, but no-one had forced South to jump to game. The double increased the N/S share of the match points from 165/39 to 196 196/08.

West led the ♥8 and declarer won with dummy's ace and played a club for the queen and ace and another club, West winning with the king. A diamond switch would have been good at this point, but West preferred a heart. When she came in with the ♠A it was essential to play a diamond and failing to do so allowed declarer to duck a spade and then take advantage of the 3-3 break to dispose of the losing diamond. The overtrick increased the score from 129/75 to 178/26

North led the ♥J and declarer won with the ace and played a diamond, ducking when North produced the jack. North's next move was to lay down the ♣A, and when South followed with the eight he unwisely continued with the ♣2. Declarer won that and should now have tested the diamonds, cashing the king, then playing a diamond to dummy's ace followed by four rounds of spades. On the last of these, North, down to ♥1097 ♣K will be squeezed for an eleventh trick.

However, declarer did not spot this possibility and cashed dummy's hearts immediately for +630 and 73/131. +660 would have changed the score to 14/190.

There was no defence and +670 gave N/S 203-1.

In theory E/W can make eight tricks in hearts, but it is easy to see how declarer might go wrong in hearts and that would be important if the contract was 3♥ doubled. However, even -100 would still see N/S score 170-34.

If North happens to be at Thursday's seminar I'll ask him why he didn't bid 5♣ – a few pairs were allowed to play there for 182/22 (one lucky partnership made 6♣ for a maxim 204). 6♣ doubled down one was worth 159-45, but you risk driving E/W to 6♥ – and those who played there and made it (doubled of course) racked up 1/203.

North led the ♠8 and South won and tried the ♦Q. Declarer won with the ace and laid down the ♥A for +480 and 56/148.

A solid, not unlucky session saw N/S move up to fifth place – another 60% today will surely see them on the podium.

Against 6♥ West leads the queen of clubs. You win in hand and play the jack of diamonds. West rises with the ace of diamonds and continues with the three of clubs to the ace. You ruff a small diamond with seven of hearts, cash the ace of spades, ruff a spade with three of hearts and ruff a diamond with queen of hearts. West shows out, discarding the seven of clubs.

There are two options:

- play for the trumps to divide (♥A, heart to the king and another diamond ruff);
- continue on cross-ruff lines.

Veri Kiljan of The Netherlands adopted line a and had to concede one down. Frederic Wrang (Sweden) and Bob Drijver (The Netherlands) chose line b. After cashing the king of spades (which Drijver had done a few tricks earlier) how are you going to make a trick with the five of hearts: by ruffing a spade or by ruffing a club?

FYI: both West and East have played the spades up-the-line (West 2, 3, 7 and East 4, 5, 10); East played ♣4 on the first trick and ♣6 on the third. FWIW: their convention card says high-low shows an even number.

Options for Friday Excursions

Option A

East of Madeira

Coach leaves Vidamar 9.45. Lunch included

Explore the eastern side of the island, with its breath-taking views, enchanting laurisilva (laurel forest) and traditional villages. A stop at the Ponta do Garajau viewpoint (statue of Christ the King, magnificent view over the Atlantic) is followed by a scenic drive through the laurisilva to Poiso and Pico do Areeiro, the third-highest peak in Madeira, 1818 m above sea-level. There are spectacular views from the road up to the mountain; in good weather you can see cotton-wool clouds hanging in the valleys below. The tour continues through the forest to Ribeiro Frio, a nature park with trout hatchery. On the way to Santana you will be able to admire the rich green of the terraced fields. Lunch in Santana, a beautiful village on the north coast, with its famous triangular thatched houses. The route back to the hotel passes through Machico, the first landfall of Zarco and Tristão Vaz Teixeira when Madeira was discovered in 1419. Time of return to hotel to be confirmed.

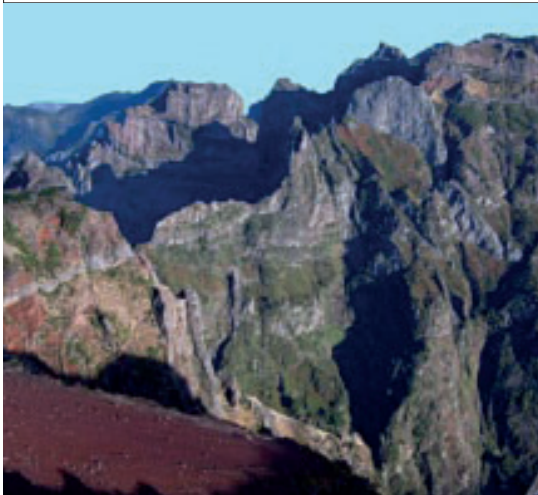


Option B

Catamaran Trip (3 Hours)

Coach leaves Vidamar 9.30

A relaxing trip along the south coast of Madeira, with a good chance of spotting whales and dolphins in all their magnificence and in their natural habitat.



Option C

Jeep Trip (4 Hours, Min 8 persons)

Coach leaves Vidamar 10.00

The tour stops first at the Miranda viewpoint, with superb views over the Bay of Funchal, and continues to Vale do Paraíso (Paradise Valley), with optional 20-minute break. The route then climbs to Pico do Areeiro (1818m), the third-highest peak on the island and the most visited. The next stop is Santo da Serra, followed by Portela, where from the viewpoint Porto da Cruz and Faial can be seen. The excursion ends with visits to Fonduras and then Machico. Drop-off at your hotel.

Michael Gromoeller and Helmut Haeusler gave the Dutch Pair of Hans Klarenbeek and Marcel Winkel some lessons in bidding and play.

Gromoeller opened a weak no-trump and Haeusler enquired with Two Clubs. After a response of Two Diamonds, West decided to investigate a little more with Two Spades. When East showed a 2-3-4-4 pattern, he did not bid Seven Hearts but chose 7NT instead. That was a bummer for

N/S, since Hans Klarenbeek (North) held a sure trump trick in a heart contract. Against 7NT, Marcel Winkel led the two of diamonds and, before claiming, declarer tested hearts by leading the ace. He cashed two more of those and then played a few diamonds. The bad news did not really hurt him so far. Because South was the favourite one to hold long clubs now, Gromoeller took a first round finesse of the club jack, where cashing a high club first was fractional better play. When the club nine won the trick, but clubs were 3-3 from the beginning, Gromoeller was visibly disappointed. Now he would not make the newspapers for his grand slam. I got news for him; he sure did! They left the table, leaving us with only 12% for this board. We won't complain with so many boards remaining....

A priori the chance for the spades to be four-four is 32.7%. Clubs 6-2 is only 8.6%. Wrang looked no further and ruffed the eight of clubs with ♥5: one

down. Drijver reasoned that a spade ruff would be safe unless West held five of them and East three. However, that would place West with ♠Q-J-fifth. That was impossible because he already showed up with the ace of diamond and the queen (promising the jack) of clubs. He surely would have overcalled with such a hand. So Drijver confidently ruffed the eight of spades with the five of hearts and made his contract. Did you?

Post mortem

You may have spotted the superior line from the outset: win the club lead in dummy, play a spade to the ace and ruff a spade; diamond to the jack for the ace; club to your king; ruff the 8 of clubs with the ten of hearts, ruff a diamond with the 6 of hearts and ruff a spade with the king of hearts. You draw trumps and unless they divide four-nil you claim twelve tricks.
