Lost Focus

In bridge, like in most sports, you have to keep your eye on the ball. Sometimes in life though, your brain has a mind of his own and tells you things you don't want to hear, or better; don't need to hear. That's what happened to me on board 6 of the Open Pairs, second session:

South opened a weak no-trump in second position and West showed his majors by bidding Two Clubs. North had a handy bidding tool available; he bid Two Hearts which showed a club suit. I tried Three Hearts, but partner couldn't believe that a vulnerable free bid at the three-level meant

that game was not a good prospect. Therefore he bid Four Hearts, which silenced everyone.

South lead the king of clubs and continued with the queen of clubs. The ruffing part of my brain told me to trump that trick, but the book reading part said that I must shed a diamond, which I did. I ruffed the third club with the 10 of hearts and now all I have to do is start ruffing spades, needing two entries to dummy (which were there in trumps). That will work if spades are 3-3 but also when they are 4-2 and North does not have the jack of hearts. I played a spade to the king and one back at the ace and there was not a single cloud in the sky.

Suddenly my brain told me that North might the singleton jack of hearts and so I pulled one round of trumps. Lost focus. I could no longer make the contract (23,12% instead of 97,84%).

I should have stayed on the right track. After ruffing two spades, I could collect them all and if South wants to ruff the fifth spade, he is out of clubs and have to give me the tenth trick in diamonds. That was a missed chance to get a mention in the bulletin and the loss of two hours sleep that night. Sorry partner, I only gave away one trick 😊

Nearly 50% of the pairs reached a slam, but 40% of them played in hearts or no-trumps, and none were successful. Interestingly 15 out of 25 pairs in the diamond slam made all 13 tricks. Carina and Sven-Erik Hallquist bid the full value of their cards up to Seven Diamonds and made all thirteen tricks, I suggest they rush out and buy a Euro-Millions ticket. There were a couple of surprising results: Four Hearts and 3NT, each one off. Mark underestimated the ability of the declarer play on this hand.

For the following deal the suggestion was that the field would be in a spade slam and four of them would try for the grand slam.

a part-score but still made all the tricks. There were three other pairs who played in a heart slam which was doomed to failure. This time the field underperformed against Mark's prediction.

For this deal Mark was hoping to find someone who bid and made Six Spades. Would he be satisfied?

On two occasions the heart slam was bid, failed once, succeeded once. One pair overstretched themselves by bidding the grand slam, I will not tell you who they were as one of them is the person who invites me to the festival. Six pairs tried for the small slam and one pair succeeded after a heart lead. I believe Mark is writing up the play elsewhere in the bulletin. It is a joy to watch, the play requires perfect timing and finishes with a non-simultaneous double squeeze. Almost more enjoyable than crispy bacon for breakfast. I am sure Mark is very satisfied.

The final deal has a bold prediction that everyone will get to slam.

Nobody bid the grand slam in hearts though two tried it in no-trumps and both failed. 23 pairs failed to get to slam, though some of these were defending a spade contract by South. Seven of the pairs playing Six Hearts received a diamond

lead. The remaining 53 pairs have an automatic squeeze for thirteen tricks but 28 only chalked up twelve tricks. Maybe tomorrow's 'Mark Your Card' should include a section on squeeze play. The field definitely did not live up to Mark's hopes.



No Double No Trouble

When I was playing in the open pairs at the lovely Madeira tournament I ran into the board showed below.

finesse, cash the jack of clubs and ruff a club. To make the contract, we need to short ourselves in the trump suit, so we ruff a diamond.

At this point we can make the contract as long as West has three spades. We are quite certain that this is the case, because of how the play went so far. So we cash the king of spades, play the ace of spades and cash the queen of spades.

North opens the bidding with One Heart and East shows, via 2NT, a two-suiter in the minors. Without agreements how to proceed we end up in Six Hearts, not doubled. It should be noted that West gave Six Hearts a look for a couple of seconds before it was passed around.

East leads the king of diamonds. When dummy appears it looks as though Six Spades is a better contract and, with the minors in East, this contract hasn't many chances. If the king of clubs is onside then the two-suiter in the minors doesn't have a lot of high card points, so chances are that it is based on more distribution especially when one looks at the vulnerability. If this is the case and the spades are divided there is a chance to bring the contract home.

After cashing the ace of diamonds I played a heart to the ten, which wins the trick and tells you there is a big chance East has a 2065 or 2056 distribution. If the distribution is 2065 with the king of clubs onside we are able to make 12 tricks. We play a heart to the king and take the club

West is down to QJ7 of hearts and North has A9 of hearts and the four of spades left. When I played a diamond from South, West had to surrender. If he ruffs low we overruff and if he ruffs high we discard a spade for 12 tricks.

At many tables N/S were doubled in a contract of Four Hearts. We weren't doubled in Six Hearts. This should feel like "no double no trouble", but with the heart suit distributed like this, there were a lot of troubles. The result of making the contract resulted in a score of 97%.

Additionally an interesting situation shows up when the declarer starts with the king of hearts and plays back the two of hearts. At this point the defender is able to kill the contract by putting in the jack or queen of hearts. Ask yourself the question; would you be able to find the killing defence?

East led the ♣K and West followed with the ten. When East switched to ♠3 declarer won with the queen, drew trumps and claimed, +450.

West could not be sure his partner held a singleton diamond, but it was highly likely. It seems to me that the indicated defence is to overtake the ♣K and play two rounds of diamonds. Even if partner cannot ruff declarer is still likely to have a spade loser.

If declarer had won the second club the suit would have been blocked, but as long as South ducks at least one diamond North can get rid of the ♣J.
