The Rule Of Thirty

Bridge is full of 'rules', some of them more useful than others. Maybe it's time to introduce a new one.

Look at this deal from Round 6:

Board 18. Dealer East. N/S Vul.

E/W can make a Grand Slam in spades but your objective is to reach 6♠.

Suppose the auction starts like this:

West	North	East	South
–	–	1♦	2♣
Double	3♣	Pass	Pass
?			

Now West has alternatives, including Double, 4♣ and 4♥. East is going to bid 4♠ over any of these and at a lot of tables that ended the auction.

However, the club void means that you are playing with a thirty-point pack and West should keep on going. Once you start to think about it, assuming nothing wasted in clubs, it is hard to construct a hand for East that will not offer a play for 6♠. Here East has the totally useless ♣Q but you can still take all the tricks.

So next time you encounter this type of situation - bid up!

Cutting the Mustard

We were asked this morning about the origins of the phrase 'Does not cut the mustard' following its appearance in yesterday's bulletin in Mark's Triskaidekaphobia article. We always aim to please in the Bulletin Room, so here we are:

"When mustard was one of the main crops in East Anglia, England, it was cut by hand with scythes, in the same way as corn. The crop could grow up to six feet high and this was very arduous work, requiring extremely sharp tools. When blunt they 'would not cut the mustard'. All this and everything else you could ever want to know about mustard can be found at the Mustard Museum in Norwich."

As an additional point of interest, this question was posed by the pair who actually won the *first ever* Madeira Open Pairs 21 years ago in 1998 and finished a creditable third this year. If you were to meet them you would suspect that each of them had a picture in their attic (we will explain this reference to those who do not understand in next year's bulletins).

On Board 18 N/S bid to 4♠ for another routine flat board. Not very exciting so far.

On Board 19, E/W both reached 3NT and made for yet another flat board – but it could have been more interesting.....

3NT by East (or West) is a tricky contract as there is only one entry to declarer's diamond suit (the ♣10) so unless N/S forget to duck two hearts and a diamond, declarer's only chance to make the contract is to cross to hand with the very precious 10♣ and play a spade towards dummy. Now we are back in familiar territory – do you play the king or the jack of spades for your ninth trick? Mr. Tacchi has a top tip gleaned from a multiple world champion. If there are NO clues from the bidding or play, then assume the person on lead has the ace. If you had followed that rule on this occasion, you would have made your contract. Congratulations.

As it happens, at the table, both Souths, failed to recognise that the ♣10 might be an entry and took the ♦A straight away, thus setting up declarer's beautiful diamonds and resulting in a flat board for 3NT+3 in both rooms.
