Pairs Entry Record Smashed



Yesterday afternoon an amazing total of 246 pairs sat down for the first session of the Open Pairs. After record-breaking entries for the Charity Pairs and the Warm Up Pairs the old Open Pairs record of 208 pairs of 2018 was smashed by over 18%. At the end of the first session **Piotr Walczak and Adam Blachnio** are in the lead with 67.64%, they are followed by **Stephen Zolotow and Anam Tebha** with 65.62% and in third place with a score of 63.34% are **Pedro Rebelo and Nuno Rebelo**.

On Monday evening before play commenced a Welcome Cocktail Party was held in the grounds of the VidaMar Hotel overlooking the Atlantic Ocean. The players were offered wines and beers and a continual and generous assortment of amuse-bouches.

INTER-NATIONS CHALLENGE (CHARITY EVENT)

Sunday 5th November, 16.00

The proceeds from this year's Charity Challenge tournament will go to the Special Education Unit at the Dr. Horácio Bento de Gouveia Middle School.

Over the past few years, the school has developed a focus on inclusivity, initiating and managing new approaches, policies and educational practices to conform with current national and regional legislation.

This focus challenges all of us to follow a clear path, the path of inclusion: of building a more democratic school, based on universal rights, principles and fundamental values that are widely shared; a school for all, without exceptions, and for each individual; a universal school, where each child and young person is given the care, attention and respect they deserve in a mainstream environment, and the opportunity to realise their full learning potential; where individual difference is seen not as a problem but rather as a value, enriching and challenging the creativity and professionalism of education professionals.

It was in this spirit that in 2013 the school embraced the challenge of creating an in-house Special Education Unit. In the intervening period the unit has remoulded itself to better meet the needs of the children it serves, and to meet the guidelines and legal framework.

Hence, the Special Education Unit:

- Forms part of the continuum of educational responses provided by the school for pupils with identified long-term difficulties in communication, interaction, cognition or learning;
- Offers a dynamic, supportive structure which brings together human and material resources with a view to achieving inclusion up to the end of compulsory schooling, and promotes flexibility in the curriculum;
- Promotes a sense of belonging and participation in children and young people in school classes, routines and activities, by a range of strategies which facilitate access to the curriculum;
- Promotes and supports access to leisure, social participation and independent living;
- Develops interdisciplinary intervention methods to facilitate learning processes, autonomy and adjustment to the school context;
- Encourages the creation of structured environments, rich in communication and interaction, which foster learning;
- Supports the process of transition to post-school life, making the most of existing school resources and establishing partnerships, and inviting the community to participate and enrich the educational process of these students;
- Promotes consistent involvement of families, and utilises technical interventions at a therapeutic level, or any other services which will benefit the students.

The implementation of these policies is possible only with everyone's involvement - everyone. And by 'everyone' we mean not only the school, but the entire community. Ultimately, it is the community - with its dynamism and the people who are part of it - which guides and gives meaning to the values the school follows. Each one of us has an important role to play in the great challenge which is the education and social integration of our young people. Each of us is an irreplaceable and essential contributor to the development of a more open, inclusive and humane society.

Optional Excursions Friday 10th November

Option A: Levada Walk (½ day, lunch included)
coach leaves hotel 09.00



The amazing Levada do Rei (King's Levada), which runs for 5.3 km and takes about 3½ hours to walk. The levada offers spectacular views of the agricultural terraces of São Jorge and Santana. The walk starts and finishes in the same location and rises from 530m to 710m along the contours of the island's interior through mature natural forest rich in biodiversity.

The tunnels formed by the luxuriant vegetation allow sight of a wide variety of species including Madeira laurels, bay trees, Madeira mahogany and animal species such as firecrest and finch. We will take lunch at the hotel Quinta do Furão and return to VidaMar at approximately 15:00.

Please bring good walking shoes or boots, a warm coat (in case of low temperatures in the mountains) and a bottle of water. Grade: easy; total distance: 10.6 km; Duration: approx. 3½ hours.

Option C: Catamaran (limited availability)
coach leaves hotel 9.00



A relaxing trip along the south coast of Madeira, with a good chance of spotting whales and dolphins in all their magnificence and in their natural habitat. (3 hours).

Option B: Over the Mountains (full day, lunch included)
coach leaves hotel 09.15



First stop Monte, a small village on the hills 6km above Funchal where you can see the remains of the almost-forgotten rack-and-pinion railway which used to connect Monte to Funchal, in particular the original base station which still stands at the foot of the hill. Monte is notable for its gardens and older green spaces, some of which are open to the public, and their exotic plants and flowers. Monte is now linked to Funchal and the Botanical Gardens by cable car. Next we will head to Ribeiro Frio, taking in a 30-minute walk along the levada to the Miradouro dos Balcões, a route lined with beautiful trees, flowers and rock formations ending in a stupendous view of some of Madeira's highest peaks; along the way you will meet some of the island's birds, which are used to visitors. You can take the time to enjoy the vegetation and the superb landscapes. We will take lunch at the hotel Quinta do Furão in the Santana area. We return to Funchal via the Guindaste viewpoint, where we will make a brief stop to admire the breathtaking view of the north coast. Return to VidaMar approximately 16.15.

Each morning during the Pairs events (and subject to demand on Saturday for the Teams) I'll be looking at the deals from the previous day's play.

This year's Warm Up Pairs was a tough challenge, not least because there were no less than six deals with slam potential.

If you play in 4♠ and North starts with the top club declarer ruffs and cashes a top spade collecting South's queen. Now being greedy by attempting to unblock the diamonds sees North ruff and exit with a trump and there are only nine tricks. The winning move is to cross to the ♠J, come to hand with a heart and draw the last trump.

However, the auction will probably start like this:

Now South's options include bidding 2NT to ask for the minor, a Pass or correct 3♣ or a gung ho 4NT.

13 pairs bid 5♣, the top score going to the pair who were doubled and made an overtrick.

The optimum contract here is 6NT by North. If East does not cash the ♣A declarer will be able to squeeze East in hearts and clubs for an overtrick.

Six pairs bid 6NT, four making the overtrick. South was the declarer on two occasions, and Svanhilder Hall found the killing lead of the ♣5!

If East leads a spade knocking out dummy's ace, declarer must assume the clubs will be good for six tricks. The only hope of a second overtrick lies in the heart suit, so at trick two declarer plays a heart from dummy. If West has the ♥A and takes it to play a spade, declarer will take 10 or 11 tricks depending on the layout of the spade

suit (and which card declarer chooses to play to trick three).

If West follows with a low card should declarer assume the ♥A is with East? There is not much to go on, but one slender clue is worth considering; if you think it is possible that East has five spades headed by the king, then it becomes a little less likely that that hand also has the ♥A, as East might have butted in with 1♠ (it would not be a great bid, but people like to bid spades).

On that basis you go up with the ♥K and have 11 tricks and 102/28 matchpoints.

A typical pairs deal – if you play in no trumps what's the best line for the maximum number of tricks?

On a club lead you can start by unblocking the ♣AK, cross to dummy with a spade and play a heart. If North hops up with the ♥A, unless it is a singleton it strongly suggests that North will also have the queen. Now you will be able to cash your winners in the black suits, executing a show up squeeze against South.

This is a reasonable slam for E/W, but it is very tough to bid.

The first question is should East open 2♥ (or a Multi 2♦)? With a dreadful suit, support for the other major, a void and an ace, I would say not, but at three tables the contract was 2♥.

Given a free run, West opens 2NT and East transfers to hearts and then bids 4♣. If West now tries a 'Last Train' 4♦ (indicating slam interest but not necessarily promising a diamond control) East might just try 5♣ confirming there are no club losers and promising a diamond control, then it is easy for West to jump to 6♥.

Hans Melchers – 1938-2023

It is with sadness that we have learnt of the death of Hans Melchers who died on November 4th at the age of 85.

From the early 1990s until 2007, Hans was a major sponsor of the Dutch Bridge Federation (NBB) of which he was made an honorary member in 2011. In 2008 he started his own professional bridge team.

In 2011 he was also awarded a Gold Medal by the WBF (after his generous support in organising the World Championships in Veldhoven that year). Melchers provided financial support to the top players in Dutch bridge for many years. This ultimately culminated in 2011 when the Dutch bridge team won the Bermuda Bowl in their own country, becoming world champions. He was also the founder, chairman and an active player of the very successful Dutch bridge club 't Onstein in Vorden.

Hans had close ties with the Madeira Bridge Festival bringing along some strong teams a few years ago.

The bridge world. will miss him.





Wham, Bam, Thank You Slam

One of the first things I do when I get a copy of the hand records is to see how many slams are available. I then try and apply the “coulda’ woulda’ shoulda’” test. I was blessed with the hands from the Warm Up Pairs as there were six such hands. So I decided to check the frequencies of these six boards and see how the field coped with them.

Our finessing friend tells us that both 6NT and 6♥ are available. Immediate inspection tells us that 6NT is a very poor contract as it requires five heart tricks and a spade trick or a 26% chance of success. 6♥ only needs the ♥K to be onside so is a 50% chance. What are the chances of reaching the slam, pretty poor I would say as you are missing two key-cards but four pairs managed it. At the other end of the spectrum one pair rested in 3♥ whilst another played 4♥.... but by East who must have played well to garner four tricks.

Again we are informed that 6♠ is a makeable contract. I far as I can see you need either doubleton ♦9 with North or the ♦A or ♦Q with South and North doubleton or trebleton ♣Q. Very poor, I estimate about 12%. Eight pairs reached the slam and seven made it, three had the lead of the diamond ace and another the friendly lead of the ♣8. The remaining three succeeded after a heart lead. In that case after drawing trumps and playing the ♦J and see the ace from South you ‘know’ where the queen is located and so your choice is to play North for the now bare ♦9 or the queen of clubs and obviously they chose wisely.

This time we have a grand slam. The play is not the thing here as I would expect thirteen tricks to be easily gathered. I think the problem is in the bidding. West with his three-loser hand will obviously open with a game-forcing bid. The art to arriving in the grand slam is to discover the third-round control in hearts. Not easy when the agreed suit is a minor. Four pairs got to the top spot, while several pairs failed in 3NT, including four who played it from the East hand after the lead of a low spade. A frequent contract was 3♠X by North and that was close to 50% (for both pairs).

The optimum contract is 6NT from the North hand, but 6♦ is playable from both sides. This one looks easier to bid as the auction might start:

North	South
–	1♠
2♦	2♥
3♣	3♦

And now when North realises South has some diamonds he can investigate further as to the possibility of slam. An easier slam to bid as we find nearly 50% of the field reached the contract. Three reached 6NT from North and the same number from South, two made it and one failed on the club lead.

If you were going to play in slam then you would probably choose 6NT although as the cards lie six in either minor is makeable. 6NT is not a good contract as you need four heart tricks or not lose two heart tricks and find a fortuitous lie of the diamond suit. Not good odds, probably in the region of 20-25%. However, a dozen pairs climbed to the slam and two thirds of them took advantage of the favourable layout of the cards.

The final deal of the session and our sixth possible slam. Not a bad slam as one of two finesses will allow you to make twelve tricks: 74% chance of success. It looks a difficult slam to bid and that is discussed in another article within this bulletin. We all know that bidding after an opening 2NT is notoriously difficult. Two pairs achieved this feat, one was fortunate enough to be doubled and so now had a complete top rather than sharing it the other successful pair.

A Dozen Tricks

Board 26 of the Warm Up Pairs was an amusing little hand. You will have read in an earlier article in this bulletin that there are 12 tricks available for E/W declarers playing in 6♥. It is not often though that one makes 12 tricks in defence.

East found the killing lead of a heart through dummy's king and declarer could only get away with making one trick with the king of diamonds for -800 (why are the boards always vulnerable when you have a bidding misunderstanding?). However – all was not completely lost – it was not a bottom because E/W have 6♥ on. Sadly for N/S only two pairs managed to find that (one was doubled!).

Note - our E/W would also have done extremely well compared with the par score of 7♣* for -1100, but no-one found that either.
