Where The IMPs Are

Although the deals were not particularly exciting, each match contained at least one deal where it was easy enough for a significant number of IMPs to change hands.

If N/S play in 4♠, the only lead to put the defenders one step ahead is a diamond (a logical choice, especially if South has opened 2♣). That solves the problem of the third diamond, but declarer cannot come to ten tricks.

If declarer plays a heart, hoping to score a ruff in dummy, West can win and play a second diamond. Declarer wins and plays a second heart, but East wins and can switch to a low club for two down via a defensive cross ruff and trump promotion, or a spade, which is good enough for one down.

If West leads a heart East wins and switches to a spade but declarer wins and plays the ♣A. If West discards, declarer continues with a heart and the best West can do is win and play a third heart, forcing dummy to ruff. However, declarer now throws a diamond on a top club and loses only three tricks.

If West ruffs the ♣A and exits with the ♠Q, the lucky position in diamonds comes to declarer's rescue.

If the bidding starts 1♣-(1♠)-Pass-(2♠) South doubles and North jumps to 4♥. Not so easy for South to bid on. However, many pairs missed game so +680 was frequently a game swing.

Both sides can make game in a major, and a double game swing was not uncommon.

There is something to be said for opening the West hand 4♠, although were the bidding to start 1♠-(Pass)-1NT-(2♥) you would imagine that West would not sell out to 4♥.

In the modern era starting the East hand with a Pass is a little conservative, but having gone down that route East is certainly worth 4♦ at this point, when there is reasonable chance that E/W will get to 6♦.

South leads the ♠2 and declarer takes dummy's ace and cashes the top diamonds, getting the bad news. However, all is not lost. Declarer cashes the ♥Q, plays a heart to the ten and after which the ♣A and the ♥AK take care of the losing spades.

Winkel Doubles

I received a missive from Marcel Winkel suggesting that aggressive bidding pays off – read below and see if you agree.

Inflation on take out doubles; dangerous or not?

Since you have ten points on average, an opening hand is hard to find nowadays. But you can always bid on less values, when you have the right shape: board 11 of the Opens Pairs, second session

After two passes, North opened a natural One Diamond. With nearly an opening hand and both majors, I fancied a takeout double in the East seat. South bid One Spade and partner came alive with Two Hearts. That went round to South who now showed her club suit with a Three Clubs bid. West was not impressed and pushed on to Three Hearts. North had heard enough and rang the bell. That silenced everyone and I was preparing for my second apology this tournament. After North led three rounds of diamonds, he was the one who had to apologise. Declarer ruffed the third diamond high in dummy with the king of hearts, drew three rounds of trumps and finessed the spade king. All N/S made were a trick in each black suit and two diamonds. It was a full 100% score and as it was the first board of the day, I was encouraged to do this more often. Inflated bidding: if you want to get ahead of the field; bid until your ears drop on the table! (*I expect this is a Dutch expression. Ed*)

At one table North opened Five Diamonds and when this was passed to West he doubled and the defence took six tricks (it could have been seven) for four off and 1100. At the other table North essayed a mere Four Diamonds which again was passed round to West and again a Double was forthcoming. East taking out to Four Hearts. North was not finished and tried Five Clubs, apparently a red rag to East who, rather than doubling tried Five Hearts. South checked his hand again and the bidding cards on the table and produced a red card. The defence took two aces and four trumps for four off for another 1100. Unfortunately for one of the two teams they did not cancel each other out and so that was a score of 19 IMPs.
